We all know parking is one of the most important and passionately-discussed issues in our downtown. The cost of parking and parking availability for customers and employees are issues I have heard many times in my service on the Board of the MDA. Parking is a significant element to the Downtown Master Plan and our new Park Place Parking Structure is a direct result. An additional structure and modernized parking meters are also important elements included in the Plan.

The Missoula Parking Commission is conducting a series of meetings to discuss modernization options for the parking meters. The existing meters are over 60 years old, out of date, out of parts and have been unreliable. Some complain about the meters running fast and getting tickets unfairly. The first meeting was held March 6 and attended by about 50 people. This informational meeting was the first public meeting to be held on the subject. We heard that people are concerned with the cost of new meters, parking rates and affordable parking for downtown employees and customers. These are critical issues for our downtown business owners and their customers. We will continue to

Connect to Smart Parking

In an effort to obtain as much public participation as possible, the Missoula Parking Commission (MPC) will host the next round of public meetings on its parking meter modernization project April 15-16 in Downtown Missoula. Consultants Dennis Burns and Vanessa Solesbee will be back in town to acquire more information and input on the types of technologies Missoulians wish to see.

All downtown stakeholders are encouraged to attend one or more of the meetings to be held at the Holiday Inn Missoula Downtown (200 S. Pattee). The Parking Meter Open House will take place Wednesday, April 16 from 6-7:30 pm, and all Missoulians are encouraged to attend. Burns and Solesbee will present on the options and technologies available and the pros and cons of each option. Public input and feedback is needed and appreciated.

is part of the parking strategy of the Downtown Master Plan that was unanimously approved by the Missoula City Council in August of 2009. Dennis Burns of Kimley-Horn, along with Vanessa Solesbee from The Solesbee Group have been contracted by the MPC to oversee the public process and selection of appropriate technologies to improve the on-street parking experience in Downtown Missoula.

The MPC Board of Directors and staff encourage participation in the process and value the public's input on selecting the best meter technologies for our community. encourage the Parking Commission to evaluate options that address these issues and allow for modernization of the old meters.

We need to hear from everyone downtown on this issue. A number of options were presented at the meeting including individual meters that accept coin, cash or credit cards and pay station installations. Some even allow extending your meter time via cell phone. That would come in handy for me many days of the week when City Council is especially windy. The next set of meetings will be April 15 and 16 when the consultants will meet with Stakeholders and conduct another Public Meeting. Please plan on attending and weighing in on this important issue and how it affects your business and employees.

The Parking Commission has

been a valuable and engaged partner for Missoula's Downtown. They have invested millions of dollars in the three parking structures we have downtown. This allows for a higher intensity of land use, i.e. buildings filling in parking lots like the new downtown Garlington Lohn & Robinson building.

This allows more employees downtown which means more customers for businesses and a more robust downtown. New, strategically placed parking structures will allow additional redevelopment and infill of parts of downtown. This was a primary strategy of the Downtown Master Plan. Updating our old meters is probably long past due. Let's look for creative ways to do that, keep costs down and have a vibrant business environment for everyone.

What's on Tap for BrewFest?

The birds are chirping in Downtown Missoula, which means Garden City BrewFest is just around the corner. Montana's oldest and largest craft beer event returns to Caras Park Saturday, May 3, from 12-8 pm. The MDA is proud to be the lead supporter of the Missoula Craft Beer week with the 22nd Annual Garden City BrewFest culminating the weeklong celebration of craft brews.

The MDA, in partnership with local distributors and breweries, will showcase over 60 beers and nearly a dozen wines. Beer category winners will be determined by the Zoo City Zymurgists, a Missoula-based home-brewers club.

Since being gifted to the MDA in 2003, the Garden City BrewFest has continually grown. We are looking forward to hosting nearly 6,000 folks in the heart of Downtown Missoula this year. BrewFest goes can purchase a 7-ounce commemorative glass plus two beer tokens for \$12;



additional tokens are just \$1 each. Food will be provided by Sentinel Kiwanis Club, along with some Missoula mobile food favorites.

This year's Garden City Brewfest sponsors: Bayern Brewing, Five on Black, and Thirst Gear. Thirst Gear is a human-powered bar on wheels. Don't worry if you are having difficulty imagining what that looks like. The Thirst Gear Pedal Pub will proudly be displayed at the event.

The MDA needs plenty of help for the event. Watch for the volunteer call coming later this month. We are fortunate to have reliable volunteers to staff events. Grab some coworkers and represent your organization as a group of dedicated Downtown volunteers!

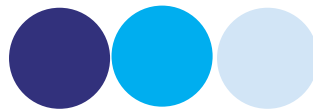
