#### Symphony Missoula Orchestra Presents Ninth Annual "Symphony in the Park"

No shirt, no shoes...come anyway! As inner tubers can attest, the Symphony in the Park is a concert for the entire community, flipflops and all. Now in its ninth year, this free concert in Caras Park is one of Mis-

soula's most popular events and draws crowds of 5,000 people, not including the onlookers from Higgins Bridge and those pulling off the river for the show.

"I'm really proud of Symphony in the Park," says John Driscoll, Missoula Symphony Orches-

tra Executive Director. "We started this free concert back in 2005, hoping we'd get a thousand people to show up. It's been one of Missoula's largest single-day events since that first year, and to see Caras Park jam-packed for a Symphony concert – not a rock concert – is just the (cont. next column)

best. This is our gift back to our community for their support, and the community's attendance reflects just how much Missoula loves their Symphony!"

This year's show, which takes place Sunday, August 11 at 7pm, includes a program of movie scores, dance numbers, classics and even some disco. According to Music Director Darko Butorac, the audience can expect a fun and lively show. "There will be something for everyone, young and old." Want dramatic? How about Mussorasky's "Night on Bald Mountain" of Fantasia fame. Feelina sentimental? Jerome Kern's "The Way You Look Tonight" should cover it, slow dancing encouraged. Add some of the aforementioned disco (think Saturday Night Fever), a beloved Beatles tune, and some classic pieces from Les Miserables, and we've got a show to remember. "This is my favorite concert of the year and I assure you it's going to be fantastic," says Butorac.

Although many people bring a picnic, concert goers also have the option of purchasing dinner and cocktails from on-site vendors. Big Dipper Ice Cream truck will also be there selling its custom made "Bachalatte" ice cream. The coffee/dark chocolate chunk concoction was created in honor of the Symphony in the Park and, for those

> who can't wait for the concert, can be purchased at Bia Dipper starting the first week of August.

> Picnic or not, Driscoll recommends getting to the concert early to get a good spot, and

bringing a lawn chair or blanket to sit on. For those who want to ensure a place, limited reserved seating is available for advance purchase through the symphony office.

On Saturday, August 3, the Clark Fork Coalition (CFC), in partnership with Milltown State Park, Friends of 2 Rivers, and Friends of the Civic Stadium, will host the Missoula River Fest to celebrate the Clark Fork River and the conservation successes that have made western Montana a vibrant place to live, work, and play. "We have so much to celebrate we've removed a dam and restored the confluence of two great rivers in western Montana," said CFC Executive Director Karen Knudsen. "Now, we're going to come together for the first time as a community to float the restored river on one special day."

People of all ages are invited to attend this free, unique community gathering featuring:


