To plan this year's event, the Missoula Downtown Association has contracted with Logan Foret, owner of Bassface Productions. Under the leadership of Foret and a BrewFest committee chaired by Buchanan, the event takes new shape at Caras Park. "I am extremely excited to be working with the MDA to host a great event that will only continue to grow and involve more of our local community," says Foret. The MDA is happy to have a BrewFest team that understands the value in connecting people downtown and looks forward to the flair they are



flair they are bringing to Winter Brew-Fest III.

Kegs will be tapped when the workweek ends at 5pm. Admission is \$10 per per-

son and includes one 7-ounce commemorative glass and two beer tokens. Additional tokens are \$1 each. Moviegoers at the Big Sky Documentary Film Festival are invited to walk over from the Wilma Theatre after the free opening night film, Nina Davenport's "First Comes Love." Bonfires and heaters will be extinguished at 10pm, but everyone is welcome to seek warmth in downtown restaurants and bars afterward.

Folks attending will be required to show identification at the entrance, located on the west side of the Caras Park Pavilion near the Carousel. Parking is free downtown evenings and weekends, and attendees are encouraged to use alternative forms of transportation. Mountain Line bus service runs until 8 pm, and the University of Montana UDASH shuttle runs 15-minute service late into the night for those staying until 10.

At Winter BrewFest III, Missoula will be reminded how lucky we are to have an active community life, even during chilly winter months that make most folks want to stay indoors. So come witness the winter revival of our favorite public park the laughter, live music and neighborly chatter; the glow of familiar faces around crackling fires; a bite of hot food and the frothy head of a dark winter ale; hats, gloves, scarves and smiles. It's everything vou love about summer in Caras Park, and you'll see it again on the night of Winter BrewFest III - Friday, February 15.

Missoula is quickly becoming known for its great variety of food choices and its focus on locally-grown meats, dairy items and produce. In large part we can thank the Community Food & Agriculture Coalition of Missoula County (CFAC), for its role in making more of these foods available to all of us. CFAC, a new MDA member, is a non-profit multi-stakeholder coalition that addresses community needs related to food and agriculture in a comprehensive and creative way.

Although this a fast-growing national movement, CFAC is locallybased and relies on the dedicated involvement of citizens, public officials, and people with a range of interests, such as farmers and antihunger advocates, in working to secure and maintain the health of our local food and farming system. As a membership organization, CFAC has helped put local food on the public agenda -- including farmland conservation, our local food economy, and the health of our children.

According to Bonnie Buckingham, CFAC's Executive Director, CFAC has a number of major priorities. They include working to create

CFAC wants to help develop those new businesses that wish to be part of that farm-to-table network. According to Bonnie, CFAC is working with the Sustainable Business Council to localize our food system so that it becomes an economic driver. This includes indentifying and promoting local restaurants that are seeking to find locally-produced foods.

Missoula Wayfinding

Efforts are underway in Missoula to develop an attractive, multifaceted naviga-

tion and marketing strategy that will enhance the Garden City experience for visitors and residents alike. Nationally, it's called Wayfinding. A major planning effort starts in February and will take six to eight months



to complete. Among many other benefits, a good wayfinding system can lead people to appealing destinations downtown, ease parking, and build a pleasant, welcoming vibe for increased foot traffic and retail customers.

Wayfinding utilizes a combination of tools and strategies to help navigate among destinations and promote the best a city has to offer. These include pre-arrival technology (websites, online maps and GPS), in-town technology (mobile apps and bar coding), and cohesive, well-designed and integrated signage and kiosks.

Good wayfinding systems under-

score the unique character of a place and eliminate excessive signage, improve parking and travel for bikers, motorists and pedestrians, simplify accessing destinations and increase the positive economic impact of visitors to Missoula.

Nearly two years ago, representatives from a broad cross-section of Missoula's agencies and organizations began meeting to explore this recommendation of the Downtown Master Plan, which was adopted in 2009. After studying local needs, collaborating, fundraising and completing an extensive selection process, a wayfinding firm named MERJE has been selected to design Missoula's system. MERJE has helped forty cities with wayfinding. Destination Missoula is the lead organization representing our aroup in the process.

Initial public planning meetings will begin in late-February. Everyone is invited to attend and give

input on how Missoula should approach wayfinding.
