### Big Sky Documentary Film Festival Announces Selections for the 13th Annual Event

ore than 200 films have been selected for screening at the 13th Annual Big Sky Documentary Film Festival (BSDFF), which takes place February 19-28, 2016, in Downtown Missoula, MT. The 2016 lineup was curated from over 1,500 submissions, which was the largest, most competitive open call for submissions to date. Entries came in from around the world, and feature an array of films covering all non-fiction forms and genres. 2016 is another year of growth for BSDFF, with more screenings in more venues than

ever before.

Continuing a 10-year tradition, the festival kicks off on Friday, February 19 with a free public screening of an upcoming feature from HBO Docu-

mentary Films. This year's opener is MAVIS!, an intimate look at the life of gospel/soul music legend and civil rights icon Mavis Staples and her family group, the Staple Singers.

In addition to the lineup of new films, BSDFF welcomes Lucy Walker and Ondi Timoner, two hugely talented and influential directors, as retrospective artists. Walker, a British director whose films include features The Crash Wheel and Waste Land, has earned more than 80 awards and two Academy Award nominations. BSDFF will screen her entire body of work, as well as a new virtual reality project. Timoner is the only two-time recipient of Sundance's Grand Jury Prize, for the documentaries Dig! and We Live in Public. Seven of her films will be screened during the 10-day festival, including her 2015 film, Brand: A Second Coming, about the actor, comedian and activist Russell Brand. Walker and Timoner will be among the many filmmakers in attendance, offering festival goers the chance to engage in postscreening Q&As.

The themes of "impact" and "change" are at the forefront of this

#### Tourism Business Improvement District offering funding for events aimed at bringing visitors to Missoula

ithin the past year, the Missoula Tourism Business Improvement District (TBID) has awarded \$77,500 through its grant fund which equates to a potential direct economic impact of \$5,725,358 for Missoula. "The opportunities provided by the Missoula Tourism BID [TBID] grant program allow for organizations to bring events and conventions to Missoula," said Linda McCarthy, executive director of the Downtown Missoula Partnership. "These events and conferences are good for our economy because folks spend money in our hotels, restaurants, coffee shops, retail stores and gas stations. Bringing tourists, sporting events, conferences or conventions to the Garden City is a good piece of business for all.'

The Missoula TBID grant funds are generated from a \$2 per-roomnight fee collected by participating hotels. The purpose of the Missoula TBID grant fund is to provide funding for new and/or growing events, preferably in non-peak months (October-April) that will provide an economic benefit through increased hotel room nights and other spending within the Missoula Community.

"The [Missoula] TBID grants have served our hotel community well and stimulated our local economy almost from inception," said Dan Carlino, general manager of the Doubletree Missoula Edgewater. "As a TBID organization, we have been able to financially support organizations in order to bring groups and/or events to Missoula that would have otherwise gone elsewhere."

The next application deadline for the Missoula TBID grant fund is March 1. Destination Missoula and the Missoula TBID hope to generate as much awareness around the availability of these funds as possible so that more event planners from Missoula will apply.
