Shake Off the Winter Blues and Try Some Brews

Annual Winter BrewFest Comes to Caras Park Saturday, February 17

The Missoula Downtown Association will host the eighth annual Winter BrewFest on Saturday, February 17, 2018 from 3-9 pm. Held at Caras Park, it will feature live entertainment, beer, wine, food, and more. The public is invited to sample a variety drinks while experiencing a unique winter-time event in the heart of Downtown.

In addition to showcasing over a dozen microbrews from Montana's finest breweries, a brand new feature this year at Winter BrewFest is a mixed drink bar with tastings from The Montana Distillery and Montgomery Distillery with both cold and hot options, alongside a hot drink bar where non-drinkers and designated drivers can warm up with coffee and hot cocoa.

This year's event will also feature a DJ for the first time alongside food from some of Missoula's best food trucks. Grab delicious eats to pair alongside your brews from El Cazador, Big Thai Country, Just BBQ, and Polka Dot Patties. Attendees can stay warm throughout the event with burn barrels and propane heaters.

By moving Winter BrewFest to a Saturday, the event hopes to give families a way to connect with Downtown by offering free Carousel rides and s'mores making from 3-5pm thanks to Farmer's State Bank. After visiting the Carousel, families are encouraged to head to the Caras Park pavilion for hot drinks, dancing, and food.

While Winter BrewFest is free for all to enjoy, those looking to taste beers, wine, and mixed drinks will need to purchase an official event glass for \$15 per person which includes three drink tokens. Additional tokens are two for \$3. Event organizers encourage attendees to drink responsibly and bring designated drivers – pop, water, coffee and hot cocoa will be available.

Parking is free Downtown on weekends and don't forget to check mountainline.com or the Mountain Line mobile app for routes and times for Zero-Fare buses. Taxi service and Uber drivers are available as well.

Downtown Gift Card Sales Set All-Time Record in 2017

owntown Missoula Gift Card Sales hit an all-time high at \$287,691.00 in 2017, an increase of 15% from total sales in 2016! A total of 6,492 cards were purchased in 2017, an average of \$44.31 per card.

Downtown Gift Cards can be redeemed at nearly 200 businesses that belong to the Missoula Downtown Association (MDA). Redemption rates also increased 5% last year from \$215,250.48 in 2016 to \$225,921.65 in 2017.

The Downtown Gift Card Program was started in 1997 as a paper program, and total sales in 1999 were just over \$22,000 that year. The program elevated to a more professional and modern plastic program in September 2009.

In 2015, the program expanded to include an additional outlet for Gift Card Sales at the MSO Hub on the corner of Higgins and Main. The Hub sold 1,113 cards in 2017 for a total of \$50,977, an increase of 47% from the previous year.

From 2010 through 2017, nearly \$1.5 million dollars of Downtown Gift Cards has been redeemed in the local economy. The top five Downtown businesses that benefited from the program, redeeming more than \$7,000 per year in Downtown Gift Cards, are Hide & Sole, Rockin' Rudy's, Runners' Edge, Tamarack Brewing Company, and the Trail Head.
