Don't Miss the Markets Opening Saturday, May 5 & People's Market on Saturday, May 12

There is no better place to be than Downtown Missoula during the Saturday Morning Markets, and market season is finally here! Saturday, May 5 marks the Opening Day of the Missoula Farmers' Market at Circle Square and the Clark Fork River Market at the Riverfront Parking Lot. The Missoula People's Market, also known as the Saturday Arts & Crafts Market, will open the following Saturday on May 12 – and will be located on the 100 block of West Pine Street.

The original **Missoula Farmers' Market** started in 1972 and runs every Saturday from 8 am to 12:30 pm on the north end of Downtown on East Railroad and East Alder streets. Fresh local produce, flowers, plants, baked goods and coffee are provided by more than 100 individual vendors, along with live music adjacent to the Historic Railroad Depot. The **Clark Fork River Market** started in 2005 and runs every Saturday from 8 am to 1 pm through Septem-

ber and 9 am to 1 pm in October. The market features locally-produced fruits and vegetables, meats, poultry, fish, and dairy products, as well as plants, flowers, baked goods, a variety of beverages hot and cold, prepared foods, wool and other wares from Western Montana farmers, ranchers and chefs. The Missoula People's Market, created in 1998, runs from 9 am to 1 pm and features hand-crafted arts from nearly 100 local artists and craftsmen. The People's Market will take place on the 100 block of West Pine Street. For more information, visit www.missoulapeoplesmarket.com.

Downtown Missoula Ready for Master Plan Update

early 75 Missoula-area businesses and organizations have pledged to support the efforts to update the Downtown Master Plan in 2018-19, and the Downtown Missoula Partnership has raised \$350,000 to fund the update. With support from developers, property owners, construction companies, retailers, law firms, tech companies, hotels, utility service providers, government agencies and more, the initiative to update the 10-year-old plan starts with the release of the Request for Proposals for planning/consulting services later this month. The Master Plan Steering Committee plans to have a consultant on contract before the end of summer and will start the public outreach and engagement process in September.

The update will focus on key components to a vibrant Downtown, including land use and circulation, business and parking development, housing, technology, the Caras Park corridor, the Broadway corridor and much more.

With more than \$850 million dollars of investment taking place in Downtown Missoula, the majority of the 2008 Master Plan recommended action items have been completed or are underway.

The most important components of a successful planning process are public engagement and implementation. All Missoulians are encouraged to participate in developing the new vision for the heart of our community. A total of 98 baskets are moved from Pink Grizzly Greenhouse to the Central Park Parking Structure where a team of community volunteers and Downtown Missoula Partnership staff members hang every basket throughout Downtown Missoula and Caras Park.

fficer Shelagh More, the Dedicated Downtown Police Officer (DDPO) for the last year and a half, accepted a new position with the University of Montana and will now serve the UM campus police department. She served as a city police officer for more than 20 years, first in patrol and then in the detective division before coming out to patrol Downtown Missoula.

Police Chief Mike Brady hopes to have the DDPO position filled by the end of May with an internal candidate. He and his staff are also training new Community Service Specialists.

Patrollina Downtown from mid-April through mid-June will be Kurt Trowbridge and Kasey Wilhalm, the two new officers added in 2016 to help with Downtown and misdemeanor crimes, and they will be staggering their schedules to provide patrol services seven days a week. In mid-June, the School Resource Officers will join Downtown beat.

Van Buren Interchanae **Project Update**



he Montana Department of Transportation continues roadway construction on the Van Buren Street Interchange during the month of May.

Topsoil will be stripped to begin preliminary sound barrier wall installation. Traffic control will be in place. Minimal impacts are anticipated and two-lane traffic on Van Buren will be maintained. Please be alert for workers. Drivers are reminded to look for signage and are reminded that fines double when workers are present.
