Missoula ADA Project Update


The Montana Department of Transportation continues to work on the Missoula ADA project, improving the sidewalks and street corners and making them more accessible to those with disabilities. MDT has completed the corners on Fifth, Sixth and Orange streets and recently moved to Stephens.

However, there have been some schedule adjustments that will benefit Downtown businesses. Improvements to Gerald Avenue will commence soon, and improvement on the Hip Strip will be initiated in late August or September. ADA Improvements on Higgins north of the river will most likely be deferred until spring 2019, along with the improvements on Broadway. This means the Downtown sidewalks will not be torn up during the peak of the 2018 tourism season.

The purpose of the Missoula TBID Grant Fund is to provide funding to new and/or growing events, preferably in non-peak months (October-April) that will provide economic benefit through increased hotel room nights and other spending within the Missoula Community. These funds are made available through the support of the Missoula TBID lodging partners. For every occupied room night, guests are assessed \$2.00 that is returned to Missoula to aid in tourism marketing and promotion within the district.
