**Free Horse-Drawn Carriage Rides** Saturdays & Sundays in December through Dec 16. Every Saturday and Sunday through December 16, the Downtown Missoula Partnership offers free horse-drawn carriage rides in partnership with Paws Up Montana and sponsored by Lithia For Missoula. Services are offered from 11 am-4 pm and can be found at the Missoula Art Park (corner of East Pine & Pattee).

### Festival of Trees Nov. 30-Dec. 9


