Downtown Master Plan Update Underway Community Engagement and Listening Critical to Process



'he Downtown Missoula Master Plan Update officially launched October 17-19, with more than 500 Missoulians participating in the listening process. A Community Kickoff was held Thursday, Oct. 18 at The Wilma, and 13 stakeholder meetings were held during the week. Dover, Kohl and Partners also solicited feedback at Saturday's Farmers Market.



The first and most critical stage of planning is "listening" says Jason King, principal Dover, Kohl and Partners, and we plan to listen to everyone's hope and dreams for Downtown Missoula from now through the charrettes, slated for Jan. 14-18, 2019. A charrette is an intensive planning session where community members, designers and other collaborate on a vision for development. The listening process helps the consultants identify the issues that need to be addressed in the Master Plan Update and develop innovative solutions for the city.



For the next 12 weeks, listening sessions will be held across the city. A complete schedule can be found on the Downtown Missoula Partnership website later this month. 
