Downtown Master Plan Update

With nearly 70% of the recommended actions of the 2009 Downtown Master Plan completed and an estimated \$850 million dollars of development taking place in Downtown Missoula, the Downtown Missoula Partnership launched the year-long effort to update the Downtown Master Plan.

Dover, Kohl & Partners and their multi-disciplinary team launched the public planning process last October and hosted a week-long charrette in mid-January, and nearly 1,300 Missoulians participated in that process.

Dover, Kohl and Partners will return to Missoula in mid-May to present the draft plan to the community. Once final revisions are made, the DMP will seek multi-agency approval of the plan in September.

Heritage Interpretive Plan

The Missoula Downtown Foundation (MDF) was one of 26 recipients of the Montana Tourism Grant Program, awarded in January. The MDF was awarded \$15,810 to create a Heritage Interpretive Plan for Downtown Missoula.

The demise of the Historic Missoula Mercantile Building led to the creation of the *Unseen Missoula* in the spring of 2018. The program underlined the need to develop a comprehensive plan that establishes an overall vision that helps develop strategies for communicating Missoula's history, culture, and values.

Historical Research Associates (HRA) - a prominent nationally-known consulting firm that specializes in historical research and cultural resource management in Downtown Missoula—will lead the effort to develop the Interpretive Plan.
